
Solution: Rent a Port-O-John!!\*

TO ALL MEMBERS OF THE LAKE FOREST YACHT CLUB

Dock space is again available for renting in 1986. The chairperson for the docks and mooring committee is Doug Hartmann (663-3087).

For those interested, please note the following procedures and conditions.

 Only members in good standing have the right to rent dock space. All financial obligations to the Yacht Club must be paid up to date before dock space will be assigned.

2. Only boats registered in the name of active members are eligible for mooring. In fairness to all members, no boats may be docked until your lease has been settled. PLEASE RESPECT THIS RULE AND CONFORM TO IT. Boats docked without proper identification may be removed at the discretion of the Dock Master at the owner's expense.

4. Leasees of slips may retain their 1985 slip in 1986 provided that their checks are received before April 15, 1986. Otherwise, all slips will be assigned on a "first come, first served" basis. Also size constraints may prevail. Both rules will be strictly enforced.

5. No winter storage will be permitted. Boats must be removed by November 15, 1986, or the Yacht Club will remove them at the owner's expense.

6. No boats or canoes are to be left on the grounds.

 Canoe racks will be available on a limited basis for \$10.00 per season. Store canoes upside down and remove by November 15, 1986.

8. Rates A Dock Slips 1-18.......\$175.00

B Dock Slips 1-28..... 155.00

C Dock Outside Slips(24").... 175.00

Inside Slips(22") .... 155.00

9. There will be a \$5.00 per diem charge for unauthorized dock use.

10. Carpeting is discouraged and if applied must be removed by November 15, 1986

11. If you are not renewing your slip, please notify Dock Master, Doug Hartmann(663-3087).

12. Please keep the use of carpeting to a minimum, or not at all.

You may reserve your slip by returning the tear-off portion below, together with your remittance to the LAKE FOREST YACHT CLUB no later than April 15,1986. DO NOT REMIT TO THE DOCK MASTER. You will receive confirmation on or about April 30, 1986.






