Lake Forest Facilities Update by Frank Gutowski

With the Beach Closedown on Saturday 10/21, the club is now prepared for the winter months. Even though our beach is shut down for the season, I'm sure we'll see many members at the social events this winter at the clubhouse. Here is an update on our club facility and activities:

End of Season Beach Closedown:

We had 12 members assist me with our beach closedown on Saturday, October 21st. I appreciate those that volunteered for we were able to closedown the beach operations and complete a repair project. Details of the beach closedown and repair are in a separate article in this month's Porthole.

Walkway Renovation Project November 9th to 11th: The replacement of the walkway on the south side of the clubhouse is scheduled for November 9th to the 11th. The clubhouse is not available for rental on those dates due to the project. We will have the concrete walkway and the sand/soil mounds with shrubs excavated and removed. The area will be graded, drainage installed and a new paver walkway will be installed. This renovation project will help improve the appearance of our clubhouse entrance as well as control the amount of sand tracked into the clubhouse.

Electrical Repair and New Walkway:

Over the summer we had electrical problems on the swim team peninsula which caused loss of power to the bubbler system we use in the beach area. It was determined by **Tony Maciorski** that we had a short in the line due to water getting into the conduit under the walkway near B Dock. During our beach closedown on 10/21, we pulled up the walkway to run the new wire and installed new pressure treated boards.

Dive Tower Walkway Bridge and Railings:

We had wood protector applied to all the hand railings and new walkway to protect it through the winter months. I'd like to thank **Jeff Phillips** for volunteering and applying the sealant.

New Clubhouse Kegeraters:

The Trustees agreed to purchase two new Kegeraters to replace the old models which had been in the club for many years. The new models are Beverage-Air commercial grade Kegeraters one which is set up to dispense domestic beer and one to dispense European beer. The new units are secured with both door locks and new tap head locks. We expect the new models to provide members many years of useful service at our club social functions. For those interested, the old units are operational and available for sale for \$250 each.

Docks and Canoe Rack

I see that our dock slips are now more than half empty as our members have been removing their boats for the winter. I'd like to remind all our boat slip renters that we need all boats removed from their dock slips by December Ist. This also applies to all members

Recreation Field Fence:




