### LFYC TRUSTEES MEETING MINUTES

February 18, 1991

(Minutes are synopsized, For a complete copy, please see Margaret at the LFYC office.)

NURSERY SCHOOL LFNS Chair Betty Peters reported that the fire alarm system is fully installed & all phone lines connected. She distributed a copy of the systems info packet & the roster of names for contact when Fire Co. receives an alarm. It was requested that Club pay for phone lines during months school is not in session, approx. \$26/month, which was agreed to by Trustees.

BOAT SHOW Trustee Pete Garland reported that Ed Ross had approached him about allowing a boat show to be run at LFYC. Steve DeFeo of DeFeo's Cove Marine & Marine Promotions, Inc. spoke to the Trustees. Mr. DeFeo said Marine Promotions would set up, obtain dealers, get \$1 million liability insurance and advertise the show. Club could set up a food concession. Clubhouse would be used for vendors (booths of 10 x 8) would be set up inside & rented for weekend. Set up would begin Friday, show would run Saturday & Sunday. B & C docks and parking area would be used for boat display. Admission would be \$3/adults, children free. Date set at May 1, 2 & 3. Mr. De Feo needs immediate approval since he needs at least 6 weeks for advertising and dealers to be lined up. No financial outlay by Club for this, unless it decides to run food concession. Porta-Johns would be brought in, parking may be a problem, but parking could be done at Pathmark with shuttle buses bringing in attendees. After guests left Trustees opened discussion. Some of concerns were that this is quite a large show; that if Club runs concession and weather is bad Club will take a loss; that no beer should be allowed; that people who are not club members or boat enthusiasts may unhappy about crowded streets & parking "all over the place". A suggestion was made that nursery school and swim team may want to do concessions as fundraisers; that promoters put up a performance bond so we are not left with mess to clean up. A motion was made and seconded to accept the tentative proposal with Peter Garland and Ron Sorensen negotiating for the Club. No beer will be allowed. A bond must be posted. There will be no involvement by the Club if Nursery School and/or Swim Team do not want to participate.

BEACH Commodore Paul Murray reported that he, Harry Moore& Ron Sorensen met to discuss the position of recreation director for '92. The application received last month from Marilyn Agresto was reviewed. A notice that LFYC is seeking a recreation director for '92 was sent to Red Cross & YMCA so that the committee has more than one application to review.

• Galley restrooms were looked at by Jim McGraw who will submit a proposal at a future date.





Roof is leaking & must be repaired before interior work is done — estimate to re-rubber roof, add slope, 5 yr. guarantee received, as well as one to patch only. Other bids will be solicited.

• Windows in Commodore's room bid has been received using Andersen, Cracco & Pella.

Special Trustees Meeting will be scheduled to go over bids.

POCKS Club Admin. Asst. Margaret Dam reported that members had questioned leasing rules: since leasing rules require membership dues be paid up by lease date of Feb. 15, but this is a jump forward from previous requirement that dues be paid before badges are picked up April 15, members suggest relief from full payment of either docks or dues by Feb. 15. Trustees agreed to allow half of dues payment at time of full dock rental payment.

MASTER LEASE Trustee Bob Drummond pointed out that a Lk. Forest property which had an outstanding Master Lease balance was recently foreclosed on. When questioned about Club status Club Atty Ann Huber reported that if balance was not included in writ of execution Club would lose the money. (However the deed restriction will remain after foreclosure.) To protect Club in the future, it was proposed that legally filed liens be placed on the properties in arrears. The cost per property would be a \$20-25 filing fee and \$50 attorney fee. Margaret prepared a list of the outstanding balances.






