

LFYC Trustees Mtg Minutes

April 13, 1993

(Minutes are synopsized. See Margaret at the LFYC office for a complete set)

MASTER LEASE Club Atty Ann Huber attended meeting to clarify procedure for filing leins agains delinquent Master Lease holders. Fee per lein is \$75. Leins will be filed in order of descending amount of balances. Atty. Huber discussed altering Club policy on declaring delinquency & taking action. DOCKS Trustee Miller will oversee docks this year as Doug Hartman does not have the time to continue in this capacity. Trustees will get bids on repairing collapsing piles & fingers on B & C docks. Steve Uranyi will continue repairs to dock decking.

BY-LAWS Trustee Garland requested Trustee approval of By-laws change to be offered to membership for vote. Accountants who have been asked to bid for 1993 will not if by-laws require <u>certified</u> audit. An accountant who may be willing to bid will charge more with this in place. Trustees unanimously approved recommending change to membership.

MAINTENANCE Trustees will get estimate for trimming Club trees on Commodore Drive which concerned residents. Will look into placing telephone poles to protect leaching field in front of launching ramp from compression thru car & trailer parking. Estimates being pursued for replacement of long banquet tables, also for replacing tiles around perimeter of ballroom floor.

GATE Trustee Genaud met with suppliers of electronic gates regarding estimates for installation of gate at driveway entrance near office. To save costs volunteers will construct concrete supports.

INSURANCE Trustees Drummond & Conk met with Club agent to review coverage. Suggested having rentee take out rider on their home ijnsurance as first coverage, will return w/other info.

TOWNSHIP Trustee Drummond represented Club at Council meeting expressing disapproval of vacating of portion of Ripplewood Drive thereby making it narrower.

RECREATION Trustee Lusardi suggested LFYC Moms be allowed to sell ice cream from Galley again this year, and that a cordless phone be available to rec director and security guard to more efficiently handle emergencies.

SOCIAL Steak Out will be rescheduled from June 26 to July 24 to avoid conflicts with graduations. Members responded with desire for Ball Game Bus Trip but Trustees can't see a date that will work.
