TIDBITS

Ice - The Lake Forest Trustees caution all members to be sure their children understand that the Bubblers at the ends of B & C docks DO NOT allow thick ice to form. This area is very DANGEROUS and should be avoided at all times regardless of the thickness of ice elsewhere on the lake.

More Ice - On the same note - the Marine Police recently issued a statement warning residents that they do not consider Lake Hopatcong ice of sufficient thickness to support recreational use.

NEWSWATCH

Residents in towns surrounding Lake Hopatcong are beginning to weary of N. J. Department of Environmental Protection refusal to treat Lake Hopatcong as anything but a reservoir despite record rainfalls. Presently Jersey City's Boonton Reservoir is at 93.8% capacity (normal storage capacity for this time of year is 80% - last year at this time it was at 31.5% of capacity!) Conservation in the affected Eastern counties is not being enforced while Lake Hopatcong residents suffer bulkhead and dock damage and loss of revenue for work which can only be done during the normal winter drawdown. A twelve inch drawdown authorized by DEP in December was generally scoffed at by residents as useless.

First reading for the bonding for improvements to the old Sparta Mtn./East Shores Water systems will be heard at the Jefferson Township Council Meeting January 13. Contracts for well, treatment plant and mains to connect the Weldon Mine Well will go out for bid in late February. Project Completion is slated for September 1, 1982. Meanwhile Lake Shawnee water flows through the new interconnection to supplement the East Shores water supply.

The Roxbury Township Committee is seeking support from 5 Sussex and Morris communities including Jefferson. At issue is a DEP proposal to site a landfill for all of Morris County in the landing area of Roxbury. Concerns that leachate from the dump could contaminate surrounding waters including Lake Hopatcong, and increased truck traffic on Rts. 46 and 206 are uppermost.

Newark wants the state to designate four reservoir areas tax exempt including Oak Ridge Reservoir which lies partially in Jefferson. Under a state statute the exempt status may be granted to fresh water lakes and surrounding lands open to the public. In this move which would preserve Newark's undeveloped land Jefferson Township fears a loss of one hundred thousand dollars in revenue, although, Newark has in the past been criticized for trying to develop those same lands.

John Moran has been chosen for Jefferson Township Council President for 1982. Joseph Florio for Vice-President.
