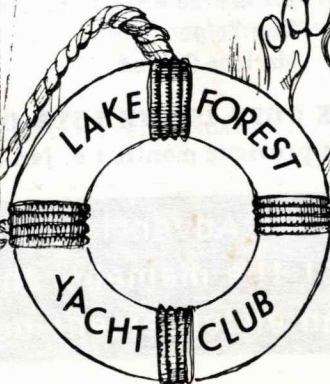
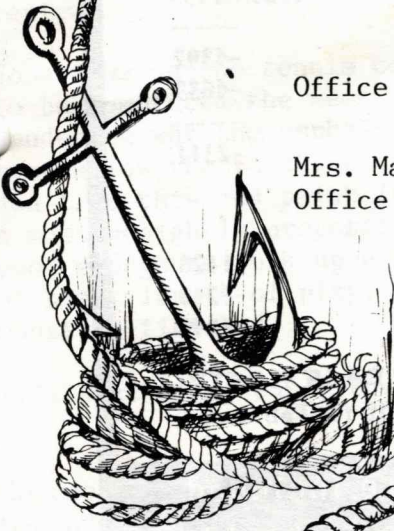

Commodore's Message

Dear LFYC Members,

The result of the July 25th Special Meeting was that the membership stated very strongly that they did not want power and water to go to "A" dock. The Trustees withdrew the proposal, and this is as it should be.

Pete Garland will be going to those people that have signed up for our bonds for the renovation. The initial amount we will raise will be \$25,000. I think it's worth mentioning to all of us that it would be a great help to the Club (us), if we all paid our special assessment in full as soon as we can. This would keep the financial strains of the improvements at a minimum, and allow us to limit the number of times we need to call in bonds to raise cash.

As far as the improvements are concerned, our hope is that we will have a proposal on the roof, whose price we can live with. The Committees will have met on 8/7/86 and hopefully we will have some progress on that aspect of the improvements.

Please note that an overview or synopsis of the Trustees monthly meeting is included in this month's Porthole. The full text and the financial report is still available with Margaret in the business office for your review.

Some news on the tennis court. Fence completion and painting is scheduled to be completed the week of August 18th. For those that have been wondering why the asphalt has had to sit for so long, it's because you must allow the volatile components, or light ends to evaporate. If you don't do this and paint it right away, the paint will bubble and peel. A most unsightly proposition. Harry Moore and Vinnie Jervasi have been good enough to work up a set of rules and regulations with regard to times of play, length of play, etc. These rules should be posted before the court is finished.

A SYNOPSIS OF THE
LFYC TRUSTEES MEETING

AUGUST 5, 1986

A report from Marlene Genaud

The legal suit to remove the restrictions on the property has resulted in extra legal fees and mailing and advertising costs. There is an anticipated cost of \$4,000.00 to \$5,000.00 for the mailing and advertising costs which was required by the Judge, plus the legal fees. It is suggested that these costs be added to the sale price of the property.

A report from Peter Garland

The Bonds should go on sale for a total of \$25,000.00. The sale should be to individuals with a deadline date of September 15. The rate to be calculated as of September 9th with 2% additional. Cards must be signed and money paid by September 15th. Peter Garland will be in the office Saturday September 13th and may be contacted at 663-1661.

Tennis Court

Harry Moore and Vinnie Jervasi will chair the tennis court committee. A set of proposed rules (see insert) have been presented. The Trustees have approved the rules for a preliminary trial.

Beach Recreation

2 lifeguards will be leaving early for college and George McGuire has requested permission to hire from within the community. The Board has said that this will be ok as this is an emergency situation.

A letter was received from Greg Kennedy requesting that a skate board area be provided. The letter will be referred to the Multi-Year Planning Committee.

Social

A contract has been signed with "Bittersweet" Band for New Year's Eve and Gallo Catering will serve the food.

Security

Guard service has been working out fine. No complaint has been registered.

Nursery School

The septic system has been located and it has been suggested that it be cleaned out. There will not be a problem with the footings for the nursery school playground. Linda Leondi has checked and feels that the fenced in area of the tennis court may pass for the fenced in area required for Nursery School.

Sand

Beach sand will not be delivered for this season as the wall must be smoothed and the rest of the forms removed.

Social

The Bloody Mary Brunch will be August 17th with another beach concert.

Tri County Asphalt

At the annual meeting of LFYC last November, a group of concerned citizens representing Lake Hopatcong communities addressed the membership with several issues concerning Tri-County Asphalt operations. Some of these issues included: quarry sound levels, routing of truck traffic, in-quarry blasting, dust control, hours of operation and operation of equipment.

The concerns were then expressed in the form of a resolution passed by the Hopatcong Boro Council and presented to Tri-County officials. Tri-County was given 45 days to initiate a plan to resolve these issues.

As of August 6, Tri-County Asphalt presented the Hopatcong Council and other concerned citizens with its plan to address the above items. Some measures have been implemented and much was promised in the next 4-6 weeks with respect to noise control. However, Tri-County Asphalt announced no plans to relocate the primary crusher or reclaim the land which is now an unsightly scar. Also, Hopatcong Mayor Hodson expressed his unwillingness to restrict the hours of operation of the quarry.

The quarry owns 900 acres and has to date only mined 50 acres, most of which is visible to Lake Forest residents. If you're concerned about the dust, noise, truck traffic and the absurd hours of operation, please contact Bill Leach (1703) for further information and future meeting dates.

P.S. The quarry is affecting the value of your home.

LFYC TENNIS COURT REGULATIONS

The tennis court is intended for the use of all members of LFYC and their guests. In order to accommodate all club members, the following regulations will apply. Open tennis time will be 1 hour of play, on the hour, i.e. 8 am-9 am, 9 am-10 am

Weekdays (Mon-Fri)

"Open time" will be available starting at 8 am and lasting until 4 pm each day. This open time is for all club members on a first come-first served basis. Players will give up the court at the end of each hour. Court time hour will be governed by the tennis clock displayed in the business office side window facing the tennis court. If no one is waiting for the court at the end of the hour, the 2 players may continue play into the next hours, only under those circumstances.

"Reserved time" play will be from 4 pm to 8 pm for adult members (over 21) only. If no reserved time is made, then the court is open to all members on a first come-first served basis, for that hour.

"Reserved time" can be made by calling Margaret in the business office at 663-0158, Harry Moore at 663-1493 or Vinnie Jervasi at 663-1797, not more than 48 hours in advance. You will be given a reservation number for that date and time which will hold the court until 10 minutes into that hour. If the court is not used by ten minutes into that hour it then becomes open court, first come-first served. The reservation name and number will be posted next to the tennis clock in the side window.

No two players may play continuously for 2 reserved hours, although one player may play with a different player for 2 succeeding hours.

Weekends

Reserved Time is from 8 am-12 noon on Saturday and Sunday. After 12 noon is open time. If no reserved time is made, then court is open on a first come-first served basis.

LFYC maintains the right to reserve court time for tournament play.

****ALL MEMBERS MUST WEAR THEIR LFYC BADGE WHEN PLAYING ON COURT, NO EXCEPTIONS. MEMBERS ONLY CAN MAKE RESERVATIONS.

RENOVATION COMMITTEE REPORTS

This page will be used each month to provide updates on all renovation committee activities. Each committee will be listed along with any updates available, followed by the name and phone number of the committee chairperson. Any questions may be directed to the appropriate chairperson.

Coordinating Committee

On August 7th the Coordinating Committee met to discuss plans for the improvement and enlargement of the playground and the continued dilemma of the roof.

Diane Faruolo reported on the progress made by the project team for the playground. Their proposal includes the purchase of an additional wood and metal structure at a cost of \$3,900 and an installation fee of about \$2,000. The features of the new apparatus include: two slides (one is a tunnel slide), climbing apparatus, chin-up bars, a firemen's pole and a multi-level area. The choice of equipment was based on the following criteria: (1) wood and metal structure for appearance, (2) climbing apparatus, (3) smaller slide, (4) small swings, (5) chin-up or turning bars, (6) multi-level area, (7) age level 3-10 years.

The second topic discussed was the roof. At this time, no decision has been made. The cost of a wood structure similar to the architect's drawing would be between \$85,000 and \$100,000. Alternatives are being considered. The proposed configuration of the roof will probably change.
