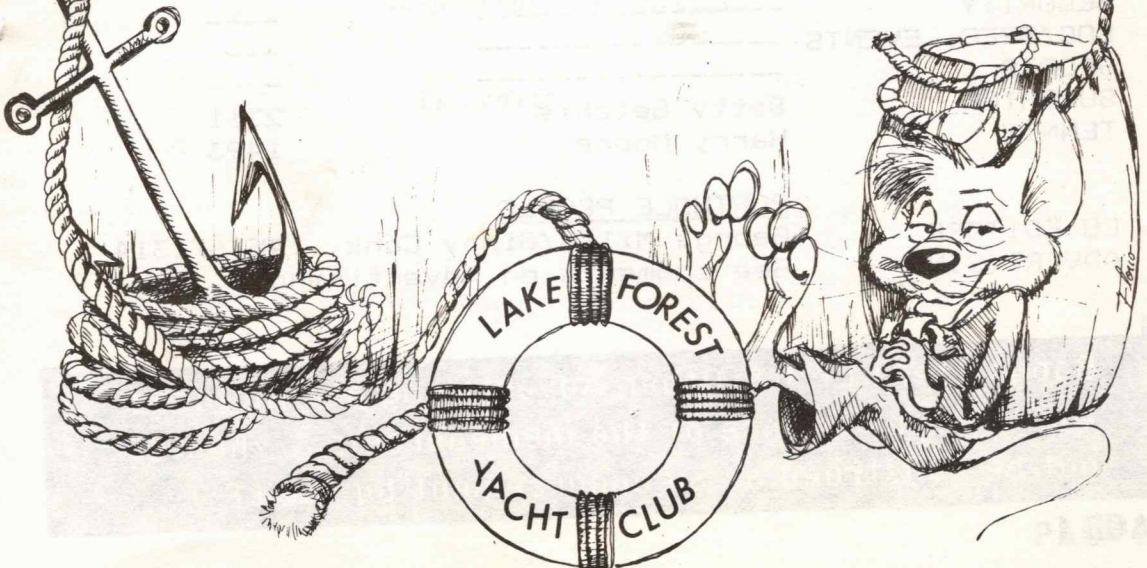

LANDSCAPING

1-5-87

The contract with Mt. Green Landscaping inc. will be renewed for the coming season.

REGATTA

The proxy vote on the Regatta was as follows:

Motion #1 26 no 1 yes

Motion #3 25 no 2 yes

The proxy vote added to the original vote defeated each of the motions.

PORTHOLE

A letter from a member was received stating concern over the Porthole as a paying job. A discussion followed and the made: We vote on overturning the decision to pay for the Porthole and continue it as a volunteer job. 5 in favor, 1 opposed, 1 abstention.

TENNIS COURT/BASKETBALL COURT

The net has been taken down and the court locked for the season. A slate walkway has been purchased for between the driveway and the court entrance for the purpose of keeping mud from being tracked onto the tennis surface. The lights on the basketball court will be locked so they cannot be turned on until the warmer weather resumes.

CLUB IMPROVEMENTS

Wayne Cornelius has submitted a proposal to put in the playground at a cost of \$2780.00 with an addition \$25.00 per hour to assemble the equipment not to exceed 16 hrs. The Board accepted this with the additional clause of completion date of May 1, 1987,

and a fee of \$100.00 per day for each day that it is not done. Margaret will draw up a letter for Wayne Cornelius and Jane Leach, as secretary, to sign.

There will be a meeting of the Aesthetic Committee Thurs. Jan. 8th. The roof design will again be looked into. The ruling from the previous Board of Trustees that an architect must be used has become a problem and the committee would like this Board to address the problem. A motion by Phil Schiff and seconded by Peter Gellas.

The multi-year planning committee is no longer required to use the services of an architect unless they feel the need for one. All in favor.

The pontoon which was removed from the property will be returned and it will be placed in the water this summer.

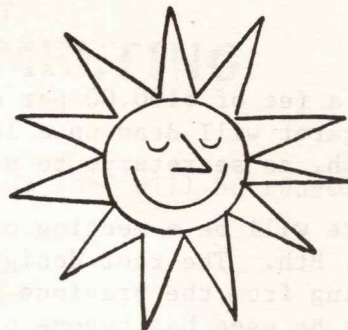

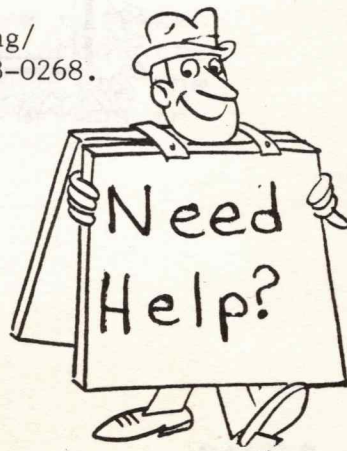

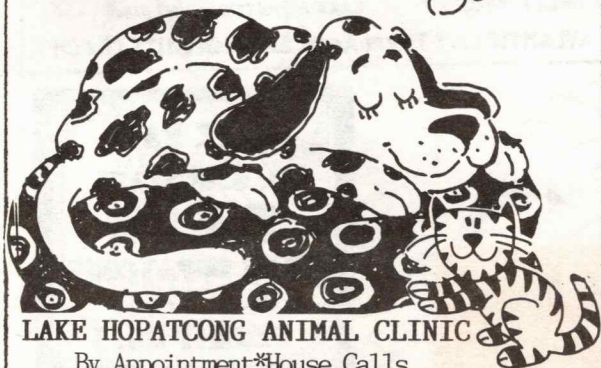
