LFYC TRUSTEES MEETING MINUTES

April 9, 1991

(Minutes are synopsisized, For a complete copy, please see Margaret at the LFYC office.)

SECURITY A report from the JTPD pointed out the security shortcomings of LFYC buildings and suggestions for correcting them. A report was received from Nursery School regarding the vandalism to LFNS property during the 3/5/91 break-in. The Trustees will contact the parents for restitution. A complaint was received about the conditions on basket ball court.

DOCK REPAIR Estimates were accepted for repair work on C dock. Dock repair work will be done when contractor does work for swim team's dock.

SWIM TEAM Peter Gellas has drawn up plans which have been sent to W. Shapiro, PE for approval, next step is Jeff. Twp. for building permit. Coach Selection Committee is interviewing candidates for head coach. Swim team members and parents will be confined to use of area immediately in front of Clubhouse, to right of diving tower, facing swim lanes. No use of beach or playground equipment is included. Parking will be designated as needed.

REPAIRS Wayne Cornelius will be contacted about replacing window in kitchen, and paint (he originally applied) in galley area. Bill Leach will be asked about repair to light over Clubhouse door and sensor/timer for outside lights.

GALLEY Margaret will call REM Vending to inquire about same set-up in '91 as '90. If this is agreeable, they should be in week of May 20.

FLOATING DOCKS Some floatation needs to be replaced. \$2,000 has been budgeted.

PROPERTY TAX Atty Ann Huber has sent in estimate for tax appeal. Margaret was asked to check on amount of time estimated to prepare and present appeal. Appeal process may begin after tax bill is received in June, and must be filed by August 15.

LAWNS Lawns will be maintained by D. Vanderhoof in '91

FIRE ALARM Nursery School is offering to have installed and pay for alarm system in Clubhouse. Trustees need to consider whether to have burglar system put in at same time—because costs would be quite a bit lower if installed at same time as fire alarm system. JTPD Community Services Officer Eric Wilsusen will be asked to address Trustees at May 14 meeting, at which time Trustees will decide this issue.

LFYC SEMI-ANNUAL MEETING NOTES

May 3, 1991

A quorum was not reached by 8:15pm, therefore an official meeting was not possible. Following are notes from an informal presentation made by the Trustees to the assembled members.

TAXES Present taxes are \$16,000. If appeal is denied new taxes approx. \$28,000. Club properties were assessed residential, causing large jump. Intial appeal that property is encumbered by restrictions was denied. Trustees reviewing who to hire to represent Club at appeal in Morristown.

SALE OF PROPERTY No activity. Survey stakes & fence no longer exist.

SWIM TEAM Team picking up new members steadily, and is still seeking more. Pete Gellas' plans stamped by Shapiro & Sons, PE of NY, town has approved building permit for platform.

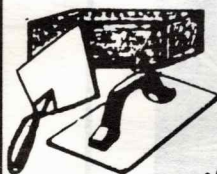
WELCOMING COMMITTEE June 2 Welcoming Wine and Cheese open to all members who would like to help welcome new and prospective Club members. (see p. 7)

MORTGAGE Mortgage paid off February. Mortgage Burning Party this summer suggested.

NURSERY SCHOOL LFNS renovation of Clubhouse kitchen nearly complete: new cabinet doors, wallpaper, baseboards, curtains, all donated by LFNS parents.

BASKETBALL COURTS Members complained of basketball court abuse: loud music, beer drinking, trash/broken bottles, behavior. Residents encouraged to call the JTPD (697-1300) who treat as trespassers anyone there between sundown and sunrise or without current LFYC badge. Club has ruled that no alcoholic beverages are permitted at basketball/baseball field at any time.
