★ The purchase of Liffy Island by Jefferson Twp with funding from a federal Clean Lakes grant, Morris County and New Jersey looks like a reality after years of negotiation that made residents feel like spectators at a tennis match.

Supporters saw the purchase as stopping further degradation of water quality in Woodport Bay, preservation of Lake Hopatcong's "most viable fish spawning area", protecting wildlife habitat and wildlife diversity, providing a "passive recreational area", and preserving the last large shoreline vista on the lake.

Pursuant to the third article of the Lake Forest Yacht Club Master Lease, annual rental charged shall be adjusted every five years, based on the purchasing power of the dollar. The lease specifies that the level of purchasing power of the dollar shall be ascertained from the Consumer Price index published by the Bureau of Labor Statistics.

Accordingly, you will find that the Master Lease rental charged to owners south of Espanong Road will be \$23.00 per quarter (\$92.00 per year), and the Master Lease rental charged to owners north of Espanong Road will be \$46.00 per quarter (\$184.00 per year).

This increase is 21% based on the figures from August 1990 to August 1994, and will become effective July 1, 1995. The last increase in July 1990 was 26.6%

LYME DISEASE STILL A THREAT IN THE REGION

Lake Forest residents and neighbors gathered at the Clubhouse just about a year ago to learn about prevention, diagnosis and treatment of Lyme disease. Steve Levinson, Director of Health and Welfare of Rockaway Twp (and a Lake Forest resident), and Dr. Ed McManus, infectious disease specialist practicing at St. Clare's and Dover General Hospitals spoke to an audience that included those concerned about the growing incidence of reported cases in our area, as well as a large number of already diagnosed sufferers. That threat has not lessened during the year, however perhaps our concern has. It should not have—the threat of contracting Lyme Disease in our own yards and the surrounding woods is still real.

No bigger than this • the deer tick which carries the Lyme disease spirochete may be effectively thwarted by using a repellent containing DEET on clothing and exposed skin, and by a thorough check of one's body after time outside. Deer ticks are found in grass and low brushy areas—a description which fits many of our own backyards. While DEET is an effective repellent its safety has come into serious question. Your best preventive action remains checking your skin after time outside for the small insects.

LFYC Tennis Court Rules

The tennis court is intended for the use of all members of LFYC, however, in order to accommodate all members, the following regulations will apply:

Open tennis time will be 1.0 hour play, on the hour; i.e. 8am - 9am.

Court time may be reserved by signing on the reservation sheet at the Club office (posted on the outside office wall to the left of the door), up to 5 days in advance. Only members in good standing may make reservations or play on the court.

If the court is not used by ten minutes into the reserved hour it then becomes Open Court, and may be used on a first-come, first-served basis. No two players may play continuously for 2 reserved hours, although one player may play with a different player for 2 successive hours.

All members must wear an LFYC member badge when playing on court. All guests must wear a LFYC member badge on court. No exceptions.

Any LFYC Club Tournament held at LFYC will take precedence over all other play. Tournament time may be scheduled for 2 hours of play before 10am Saturday and Sunday.

Old Coffee Cans will be placed in the playground area for cigarette butts. Please utilize the cans so children do not find them in the sand. Thanks for your cooperation and understanding.
