# Lake Forest Facilities Update by Frank Gutowski

Our beach is now fully open for the season with lifeguards on duty daily. We're continuing with projects to help improve the facility for all members. Here is an update on our club:

#### A Dock Resurfacing:

If you have a boat on A Dock or strolled over to that area of our club, you will have noticed a brand new dock walkway servicing those slips. On Saturday 6/10 and Sunday 6/11, we had a group of volunteers, led by **Jim Thompson**, removing the old surface boards, reinforcing the substructure and installing new pressure treated wood. The boards were screwed down with а "Duraspin" screw gun which helped us expedite the project once we got the hang of using it. The tires along the dock were removed and we will be

replacing them with new bumpers shortly. The dock has already been seal coated and we will be re-numbering the dock slips soon. The work we have done on A Dock to shore up the substructure and change out the boards gives the dock an almost new look. With the \$2,500 we spent on this resurfacing project, added to the \$7,800 we spent on substructure repair, the total cost was just over \$10,000 for refurbishing A Dock. This is a huge savings compared to the \$75,000 to \$100,000 required to replace A Dock.

#### **Beach Concession Stand:**

Our Beach Director, Donna Combos, already opened up the concession stand on the weekends in late June and members were pleased to once again have the convenience of snacks, drinks and ice cream available. The concession stand is now open daily and fully stocked with the items you enjoy, all at very affordable prices. This season, we will be keeping the prices low by using volunteers to manage the concession stand. From what I hear, working the stand for an hour or two is really easy and fun, so if you would like to help out see Donna and she'll set you up.

#### Children's Water Slide:

The support frame for the children' slide broke resulting in it becoming unstable. The slide was removed from the water and was out of commission for about two weeks. We repaired the unit using brackets in time for the July 4<sup>th</sup> weekend.

#### Floating Dock Repair:

The ladder on the floating dock

was damaged and we are unable to use it until we obtain a replacement ladder. We expect to have the ladder in by early July and will install it and position the dock out in the swim area for the kids to enjoy.

#### Painting Projects:

We have some painting projects in the works to help spiff up the appearance of the club. You may have noticed that we had Jeff Phillips pressure wash and apply a new coat of paint to the beach galley. The fresh coat has certainly helped the appearance of the 50 year old structure. We also are replacing the rusted utility access door in the galley with a new fiberglass door with metal frame. You probably also have noticed the dive tower is in serious need of some scraping

and painting. That project is also underway and you will see it completed shortly.

#### **Recreation Field Vandal**ism and Field Fence:

We had another issue in late June with a vandal driving across our field and damaging it. We had a member observe the incident and identify the vehicle as a black SUV (possibly a Cherokee). A police report on the incident was filed.

This is another example of our need to fence off the recreation field. We're still looking for any members who have access to a commercial grade auger or a pile driver to plant the telephone poles we'll be using for the fencing. We also are still searching for anchor chain to link the poles. If anyone has a contact for this type of chain or has access to an auger or pile driver, please contact any board member.

#### Parking Permit Tags

Unfortunately we already have issued parking tickets to several vehicles for trespassing on our property. These vehicles were parked overnight and had no member parking tags. We want to remind all members that parking passes, with 2006 season stickers, are required to be displayed from the rear view mirror or dashboard. Parking at the facility is only for members and guests using the facility or while attending functions in the clubhouse. If an unidentified vehicle is left on the premises overnight, it will almost certainly be ticketed.

#### Swim Lessons:

Swim lessons are once again starting at the beach with Danielle Rodgers as our swim lesson instructor. There are two sessions for swim lessons and there is a sign up sheet at the beach galley.

#### **Tennis Lessons:**



6/15/06: Meeting called to order, 7:20pm

#### Trustee Updates Pat:

Club rental calendar update: Plan to move club rentals to the office, review of procedures, rules and contract performed as submitted. Pat will discuss this change with Donna and gain her valuable input to the procedures document, then it will be shared to everyone in the next Porthole and on the Website. The intent is to have the Yacht Club rentals run out of the office beginning on July I. Pat made a motion made to increase deposit for Club Rentals, discussion ensued, rescinded motion. Chuck:

Liens: The office has successfully filed liens on a couple of residents. Decision was made that either a collection agency, or liens on a residents home will be pursued for any amount owed over \$300. **Frank:** 

A dock repair update: New decking was installed on the main walkway the weekend of 6/10 - 6/11 with the help of volunteers and under the direction of lim Thompson who volunteered his time and equipment. The life guards will be hired to seal the new walkway. Porthole update: For the first time since taking over the publication of the porthole it has turned a profit. The advertising taken in for the month of May paid for the publishing costs. Pete:

Update via email. HVAC replacement update: Elliott's Elite did receive our check, and made application for the appropriate permits. He did not have them as of Monday Work should begin in around two weeks and will take approx. 10 to 12 days to complete, with little or no impact on rentals. Most of the work will be "behind the scenes." Insurance claim update: Still pursuing

#### Augie:

Sign repair and/or replacement at the Basketball court: Augie

shared sample sign. Sample will be provided to sign maker. Will be installed at the basketball courts.

#### New Business

The Trustees have been asking to see the badges of the people using the Basketball Court at the club. Most times the players do not have badges, or only one does. They are then sent home to obtain and wear their badges. Badges must be worn at all times on club property, including the basketball court, this will be enforced by the Trustees, the Security Guards and the Life Guards.

Frank received quotes from leff Phillips for power washing and painting the galley. All approved; Dive tower, all approved; replace rusted utility door in the Galley, all approved (Pat to provide door). Discussion ensued about replacing railing on the dive tower and walk way. Frank is going to procure bids for this work using Trex like material. Concession stand will be opening the weekend of June 17-18. Concession will be run by volunteers selling product provided by the Beach Director at no

expense to the club. Will be operated not-for-profit. Beach Director requested we install a screen door on the guard shack so that children do not go in and out. Frank to pursue. Swim float needs a new ladder. Pat will procure ladder and install it. Water heater parts were obtained for galley and will be installed the forth-coming week. New code flags will be purchased for the high dive, spelling out Lake Forest Yacht Club. It was noted that the Tennis court resurfacing was peeling. Augie to contact vendor and notify him. This should be covered under warranty. Frank presented a proposal for a portable PA system to be used by the Swim team and the club for social functions. Trustees agreed to share the expense for the system, a portable Fender unit. Fred made motion. Chuck seconded, all in favor Frank abstained.

# **Dock "A" Rehabilitation & Resurfacing Project**

The Board of Trustees determined it would be in the club's best interest to refurbish Dock A rather than incur the cost to tear it down and rebuild it. We decided to take a two step approach in this rehabilitation, with the first being stabilization of the substructure and then a resurfacing project.

In April, we hired AAA Docks to reinforce and stabilize the substructure with several new pilings, replaced the missing walkout finger at slip A1 and stabilize and level out all weakened walkout fingers. The project was completed in advance of member usage of Dock A at a total cost of \$7,800.

The second phase was completed on June  $10^{th}$  and  $11^{th}$ , with the complete removal of the Dock A walkway boards. With the support beams exposed, we also installed additional 16' 2 × 6 pressure treated lumber under the walkway to give it additional support. New pressure treated boards were installed on the walkway and wood sealant was applied to protect the new wood. In July, we will renumber the dock slips and install bumpers to replace the removed tires. Total cost for the resurfacing project came out to be \$2,500 in materials.

We could not have completed the second phase of the project without the club members who volunteered their time on June 10<sup>th</sup> and 11<sup>th</sup>. I'd like to recognize, **Jim Thompson**, for taking the lead on helping me set up this

project and helping us effectively implement the resurfacing operation. I'd also like to thank the following members who volunteered their time to complete the resurfacing project:

If we had chosen to remove and install a new dock, our cost would have been anywhere from \$75,000 to \$100,000. With the cost of the rehabilitation project coming in at just over \$10,000, we have saved considerable amount of club funds. This could not have been done without the dedication of the members who volunteered on the project.

  - Payment to the Lake Forest Yacht Club in the amount of \$15.00 and the completed and signed township permit must be delivered to the club office no later than Thursday, September 14<sup>th</sup>, 2006


