### Newswatch

Election Results: Locally the status quo remains intact: Mayor Horace Chamberlain defeated Jim Opeken 2,380 to 1,875. In Lake Forest Chamberlain received 183 against Opeken's 220 votes. Councilman John Moran narrowly retained his seat by collecting 2115 votes to Bob Kramer's 2039. Moran totled up 250 votes in Lake Forest to Kramer's 150.

Winning votes for Councilman Pat Curran totalled 2170 township-wide and 238 in Lake Forest. Frank McBride received 1954 in the township and 149 in Lake Forest.

The Public Question Nos. 1, 2, and 3 on the nuclear freeze, vets funds and prison funding passed statewide and in Jefferson. Question No. 4 on community development funds did not pass in Jefferson while the results are unknown statewide. Question No. 5 on riparian ownership failed in Jefferson and N.J. Of 723 registered Lake Forest voters 414 voted on Tuesday.
