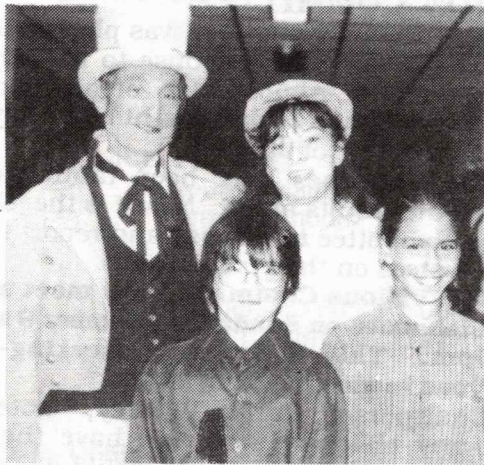
It is with regret that we inform you that Ray Reinhagen passed away suddenly on August 21 while in Pollock Pines, California.



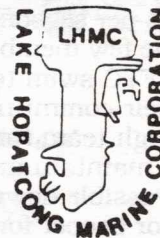

LFYC TRUSTEES MEETING MINUTES

August 14, 1990

(Minutes are synopsisized. For a complete copy, please see Margaret at the LFYC office)

BEACH/HOUSE It was decided to waive the rental fee for the Schiff going-away party. Jem Vending will be asked to remove their machines by Sept. 4 or 6 so that galley may be used for storage. The locks are in poor condition and some do not work properly. A locksmith will be called to replace or repair the locks. Water testing is being done and the reports are being sent to the Bd of Health as required. July 13 is last date received. Margaret will request that the more recent tests be sent to the Club so they may be forwarded to the Bd of Health. Ice eaters will be put back into the water for the winter. It was suggested that next year it might be necessary to hire someone to run the Galley. Possible cost would be \$5-6/hour. The galley would need to be open from 11 am to 6 pm.

BUDGET Budget was reviewed. It was decided that some necessary work can be done on the Club buildings. Wayne Cornelius will give the Trustees a price quote on the repairs.

MASTER LEASE Some residents have paid at the old rate. This will be called to their attention but interest will not be charged at this time.

DUES Past due notices will be sent to all members who have not paid this year's dues. They will be reminded that a letter of resignation is needed if that is their intention.

BASKETBALL COURT The new sign has been removed by persons unknown.

HEATING SYSTEM Harmony Heating will be doing the yearly maintenance check.

SWIM TEAM The swim team idea has been investigated. The Commodore reported to the board on the impact a swim team might have on this community:

Daily team practice times would run about 2 hrs. This could be scheduled when our facility is not used by many: 8:30-10:30am. Children would be dropped off & picked up lessening cars in the area at one time. Swim area would be unaffected. During 4 home meets per season the approx. 50-80 cars could be accomodated in our parking lot during a time few members are around (9-noon). Parking area could be restricted.

LFYC swim team provides opportunity for LFYC member children to belong to team in their community & would promote community involvement. Team is supported through team fundraising. Team could provide LFYC member swim lessons, clinics & help maintain area. A million dollar liability insurance policy would be possible.

Possible down side items are: noise-but boat noise on lake is worse; cheering; cap gun or beeper for starts-this is not a lot of noise. Extra people would be restricted from the beach side of the club. Toilet use could be solved with Port-a-John.

There are 10 meets per season, 4 or 5 at home. Finals being hosted on a rotating/availability basis. Evening meets are from 6-8:00 pm.

After discussion, the following motion was made and passed by a 5 to 1 vote: "The Board of Trustees will negotiate reasonable arrangements enabling a parents organization, the majority of whose executives or officers are LFYC members, to organize a children's recreational swim team, which shall be open to LFYC members and those not eligible for LFYC membership. Such arrangements shall include, among other things, the use of designated LFYC facilities for team purposes including practice sessions, swim meets and other valid team functions and shall consider insurance, financial and scheduling aspects all designed to be in the best interest of the LFYC."

The motion and cover letter will be sent to Club members. The Board will address the response, if any.

LEND A HAND!

Our fall clean-up day is scheduled for Saturday, September 8, from 9 am until 3 pm. Summer equipment such as the diving boards, floating docks, swim platform, lifeguard chair and the swim curtain will be placed in storage until the summer of 1991.

In addition, weeding, trimming and sprucing up of the flower bed and foundation plantings will provide for a neater appearance and an easier clean-up next spring. Coffee, danish, hot dogs, chips and soda will be provided.

The spring clean-up was a smashing success with over 65 club members participating to improve the appearance of your club. We look forward to even greater turnout this time. See you there!

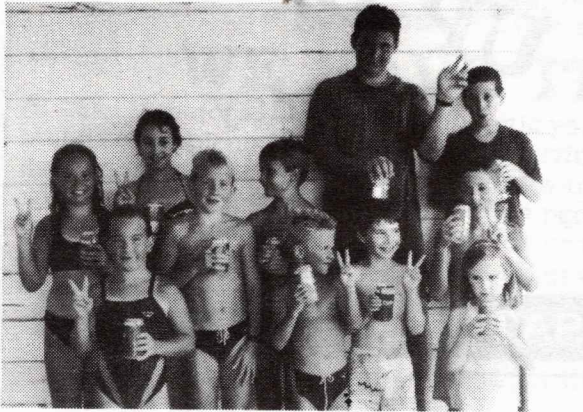

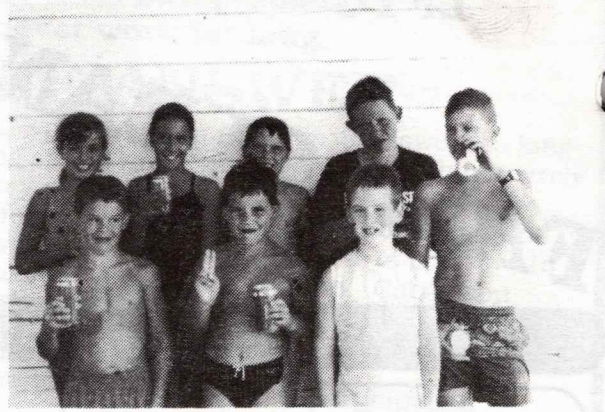

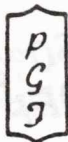

ENVIRONMENTAL NEWS

The first in an occasional series of articles on how you can help keep our environment clean.
(Parts excerpted from AIM Action News, Daily Record, Mother Earth News.)

RECYCLING NOTES

Plans are underway to establish a Recycling Center at the Municipal Garage on Weldon Rd. to accept recyclables not picked up curbside, including cardboard. These recyclables will be accepted from both the community and commercial establishments.

Mr. Peters, Jefferson Twp. Recycling Coordinator, hopes that by this month, plastic milk jugs, bottled water containers, detergent bottles, and all other plastic containers that hold liquid will be included in Jefferson's curbside recycling collection.*

NATURAL HOUSECLEANING

It's easier than you think to eliminate harsh chemical cleaning products from your home. There are many recipes for environmentally sound household cleaners. Not only are they good for the environment (including your septic system), but

they're safe for you to use and safe to have around your children. Following are a few recipes to get you started. Watch for more in the future

ALL-PURPOSE CLEANER Mix vinegar and water in a spray bottle. For something more abrasive, mix vinegar and salt, or vinegar and baking soda. Or, dissolve a half-cup borax in 1 gallon hot water, or rub the area with one-half lemon dipped in borax. Borax and water, or vinegar and water will remove mold and mildew and inhibit their growth.

FLOOR CLEANER Use 1/4 to 1 cup vinegar in 1 gallon warm water for linoleum, tile, brick or stone floors. Club soda can be used to polish the floor, too. For polishing wood floors, mix oil and vinegar into a solution and apply a thin coat. Rub in well.

AIR FRESHENER Leave out an open bowl of white vinegar.
