





LFYC Trustees Meeting Minutes

October 8, 1991

(Minutes are synopsized, For a complete copy, please see Margaret at the LFYC office.) Budget Due to the significant increase in property taxes the dues have been raised 10%. An additional increase may be needed if the appeal to lower the taxes is unsuccessful. Regatta Bill Leach, Ron Owens, Ed Ross came to meeting to ask how the Trustees would feel about the return of a Regatta to LFYC, to be run in July instead of September. Questions were raised about the financial responsibilities of LFYC, availability of sponsorship. If sponsorship is unavailable to cover prize money races would not be run. The Trustees did not feel that a decision could be made with the information available. A more detailed account of finances and responsibilities is needed before a decision is made.

Special Assessment Dropping special assessment (3 yrs to go), raising dues \$50-60 to cover new taxes & operating expenses was discussed. S.A. funds must be used for specific capital improvements, most of which have been done; while some capital improvements not specified in S.A. are needed. Membership should vote on this as they voted S.A. Need for dues increase dependent on outcome of tax appeal. Will be put to vote at Annual Meeting, Dec. 6. Property Margaret is to find out what club would have to do to have docks, launching ramp, parking at lot at end of Yacht Club Dr. If the property does not sell then this may be possible use. Property on Commodore will be discussed at next meeting.

Clubhouse The Nursery School is having a fire alarm system installed in the Clubhouse.

Nursery School News


