SWIM STROKES LAKE FOREST SWIM TEAM NEWS

The Lake Forest Swim Team's March 17 meeting accomplished quite a bit and then some. Treasurer Ed Kolton reported that Building Fund monies were coming in and urged everyone to send in their envelopes too.

The coach selection committee, Bayla Kolton, Greg Plifka, Tom Morris and Harry Moore, reported they had set criteria for coach hiring, received resumes from prospective coaching staff members, set a deadline of April 1 for receipt of all resumes and set a target of April 10 for coach hiring.

Subcommittees have scheduled the following fundraisers to raise money for swim dock building: a GARAGE SALE on May 18 run by Donna Gonabe and Leslie Plifka; a SWIM-A-THON at the West Morris YMCA on June 15 run by Jim Bashant and Marlene Genaud; HOAGIE SALE run by Liz Greene and Linda Leondi; and an off-premise 50-50 run by Ann Moore and Dee Pirrello.

Tuition for the swim team, which includes league registration, coaching, and stroke and turn instruction has been set at \$50. for the first child in a family, \$40/second child, \$25/third child, \$15/four or more children. A one-time family Building Fund payment of \$50. has been assessed. (Fees are refundable if your child decides that competitive swimming isn't for him/her.)

The Lake Forest Swim Team has been fortunate to reserve pre-season swim time at the Randolph YMCA, on May 18, 25, June 1, 8, 15, and 22, for new swimmers to learn about competitive swimming and swim teams and to meet the coach, the Swim-A-thon and preseason practices.

LFYC TRUSTEES MEETING MINUTES

March12, 1991

(Minutes are synopsized, For a complete copy, please see Margaret at the LFYC office.)

BEACH A representative from Allied Biological attended the meeting at the Trustees' invitation to explain what LFYC has done in the past to combat weeds in the swimming area and to discuss options for the coming season. Diquat will again be applied this year, however copper sulfate to treat the algae that forms in the lagoon area will also be applied. Allied's contract will allow for more than one application, of either or both chemicals, if needed. The beach will have to be closed for 24 hours after each application of Diquat. The first treatment will be in May or June and the next may be needed at the end of July or early August.

VANDALISM After a couple of incidents of unauthorized entry of the Clubhouse and vandalism to Nursery School equipment the Jefferson Twp Police were called in to investigate. At the present time Officer Hart is in charge of the investigation.

ALARM SYSTEM The Nursery School is going to have a hard-wired fire alarm system installed in the Clubhouse. At the same time a security system could also be installed. A Trustees subcommittee will look into the cost of the security system.

TAX APPEAL Bob Drummond reported that the appeal for tax reduction has been refused. The next step is to go to the tax assessor and then to the county tax board. It was suggested that the Club might do well if a registered and certified tax appeals person were hired to represent the Club. Margaret and Paul Murray will check on qualified individuals.

CLUBHOUSE Water is still seeping up in the foyer and storage closet. A number of causes are being investigated.

ACCOUNTANT Accounting services will be provided by Harry B. McGough, Jr for 90-91.

DOCKS Written estimates to repair ice damage to C dock have not been received. It was suggested that another pile be driven at C when LF Swim Team is having some pilings driven. Greg and Margaret will check into this possibility.


