NEWSWATCH

On May 26 Lake Shawnee was sprayed with "Komeen". No attempt was made to inform Lake Forest or Lake Shawnee residents, in fact Township officials (except Mr. Stoll) were not aware of the spraying until 8 days later when they began to investigate customer complaints about recent deterioration of water quality. Township officials were appalled and embarrassed to learn that water customers in neither community had been notified because, at an April meeting set-up to discuss possible spraying of Lake Shawnee, it had been agreed, among other technical points, that the Lake Shawnee Club would inform water customers prior to herbecide spraying. Those present at the meeting were Mayor Chamberlain, Twp. Administrator Bowden, Health Dept. Head Stoll and Lake Shawnee "Governors" Archibald, Bazdalski, Hansen and Mitsock. At the May 24 Jeff. Twp. Water Advisor Bd. meeting Administrator Bowden and "Govenor"/WAB co-chairperson Mitsock reported on the Twp.-Lk. Shawnee agreements and were offered assistance by Board members for the notification program.

The Weldon Mine Well transmission line has gone out to bid - with a July 21 date for opening of those bids and Aug. 4 for the treatment plant bids. The contants specify 90 days for the transmission line and 180 days for the treatment plant construction.

Due to heavy spring rainfalls reservoirs around northern N.J. are full. The DEP has, therefore, given tentative approval to a six foot drawdown of Lake Hopatcong in October.
