COMMODORE'S MESSAGE

Dear Members,

I hope that everyone will be able to attend this year's annual meeting on December 6 at 8pm. At the meeting you will have the opportunity to elect three members to the Board of Trustees as well as being involved in the decision making process on a number of key issues, including:

SPECIAL ASSESSMENT A motion is being put forth to the membership to eliminate the Special Assessment (SA) at the end of its

calendar year in July 1992.

In July 1985 1985 the LFYC membership voted to institute a SA of \$143/family/year for a ten year period to fund the upgrade of the facilities. The total of this assessment was estimated to be \$240,000 with continual review of the plan regarding any unforeseen needs and changes.

At present we have spent about 75% on projects totalling over \$185,000 and we have collected an equivalent amount with another \$9000 yet to be received before next July. The current status is listed below:

The remaining three years of SA would generate about \$75,000 of revenue which would be used to complete as many of the remaining projects on the original list or new projects as decided by the membership.

The alternative being proposed by the Board is to repeal the SA at the end of this assessment year with any further improvements being funded by the operating budget of LFYC. We feel that the elimination of this extra fee would be beneficial in our efforts to entice new membership. All membership input and discussion of this subject would be appreciated.

REGATTA The second item that the membership needs to discuss is a proposal by a number of members to reinstate a regatta at the LFYC in July 1992. The Regatta would make use of the facilities for about one week with the races being held on Saturday and Sunday. This events was always profitable in the past when it was held. Prize money is provided through corporate sponsorship, with the revenues received by the Club coming from the gate and concessions manned by volunteer members. The Committee representing the Regatta would welcome this opportunity to provide any clarification or amplification of any issue you might have.

PROPERTY The third item that the membership must discuss is the future plans for the two unused lots that the Yacht Club owns and pays taxes on. The flag shaped piece of property at the north end of Yacht Club Drive was just recently "perked" by the Board and was found to have failed the current engineering requirements to support a septic field. Alternative uses for the property to be discussed are to look into building more docks and a parking lot, continue to look for a buyer who would put in a tank system (which

Its cost of \$122 will be paid by swim team.

Property Block 121, Lot 1 failed recent "perk" test by Dig Engineering Co. Financial Dec. 4 set for tax appeal, Bob Drummond will attend w/Club Atty Ann Huber. Regatta Bill Leach, Ron Owens, Ed Ross came to meeting with estimated costs. Prize money of \$25,000 would be funded by sponsors. Club would be responsible for remaining costs estimated at \$25,000 to be funded by ad book, t-shirts, food concession, gate. Date would be July 26 & 26. Proposal at Annual Meeting including insurance info, etc.

is very cost prohibitive), subdivide the property and offer to sell it to the bordering property owners, or to donate the land as a wetlands or Green Acres. All of the mentioned options help to relieve the Club of taxes. The last option is to do nothing and keep the land for some future decision. The other piece of property which should be discussed is the piece bordering Harbor and Commodore Drives known as The Swamp. The same options as mentioned above, except for the docks, would apply to this property.



LFYC Dock Lease PROCEDURES & CONDITIONS

• Only LFYC members in good standing will be considered for dock leasing.

• A boat for which dock space is rented must be registered to the name of the member renting the space.

• No boats may be docked until the Lease Agreement has been settled. Boats docked without the Dock Master's approval may be removed at the owner's expense.

• Leasees of dock space may retain their '91 slip in '92 provided that their checks are received before Feb. 15, 1992, with the following exception: Size constraints may warrant the change of dock space. (Dock assignments & changes are at the discretion of the Dock Master.) All remaining slips will be assigned on a first come, first served basis.

• Boat must be removed from the dock space by Nov. 15, 1992 or the Club will remove it at the owner's expense. No winter storage is available.

• No boats are to be parked or stored on Club property at any time.

• Any bumper material installed by boat owners must be approved by the Dock Master. Boat owner installed bumper material must be removed by the leasee by Nov. 15, 1992.
