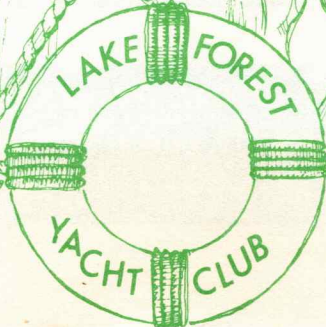

TRUSTEES MEETING SYNOPSIS

TENNIS COURT

The net winders and clips have been purchased at a cost of \$35.00. An order will be placed for a squeegee. Approx. cost: \$25.00.

SALE OF PROPERTY

Marlene Genaud reported that Judge Stein could not give a judgment. The reasons were:

1. The Judge felt the 1981 vote was stale and a new vote should be taken to reaffirm the first vote.
2. The Judge wanted to see a copy of the By-Laws.

Marlene recommended that the Trustees call a special meeting with the attorney present to answer questions. The meeting agenda will deal only with this one question. After due deliberation the Trustees passed a motion setting Feb. 20, 1987 as the date for the meeting. Proxies will be available in the office prior to Feb. 20.

SECURITY

Bill Leach will chair the security committee.

Peter Gellas suggested new rules be formulated for the winter use of the Club, with a 6p.m. closing time. Also that a guard will be on duty Friday and Saturday evenings, and Sunday afternoons. The sign at the entrance should be repainted. The Trustees have directed the security committee to find a way to improve security because of the increased vandalism.

HOUSE

Diane Faruolo contacted Everlasting Shine to find out what their responsibilities are to LFYC. A diagram should be made of the storage area so when things are put back, they go where they belong. The Trustees have told Diane to use her judgment to resolve the problem.

NURSERY SCHOOL

Diane Faruolo is concerned about enrollment for next year due to the added competition from the new day care center on Rt.15. With registration in March Diane would like to tell the non-resident mothers that they can sign up now. Registration is expected to be 13 children. 11 residents and 2 non-residents. The Trustees reaffirmed a 50/50 enrollment. Diane said funds were tight due to large increases in insurance.

Phil Schiff is working on them and they will be ready shortly.

The Brunch will be held on Feb. 22, 1987. New residents will be invited to attend as guests of LFYC. There is no chairperson for social. Sue Essig will try to get someone to chair each event.

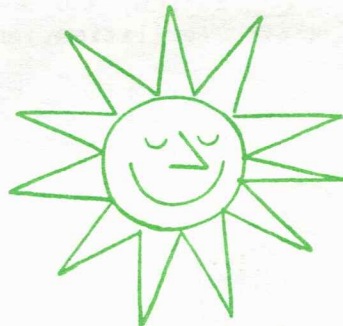

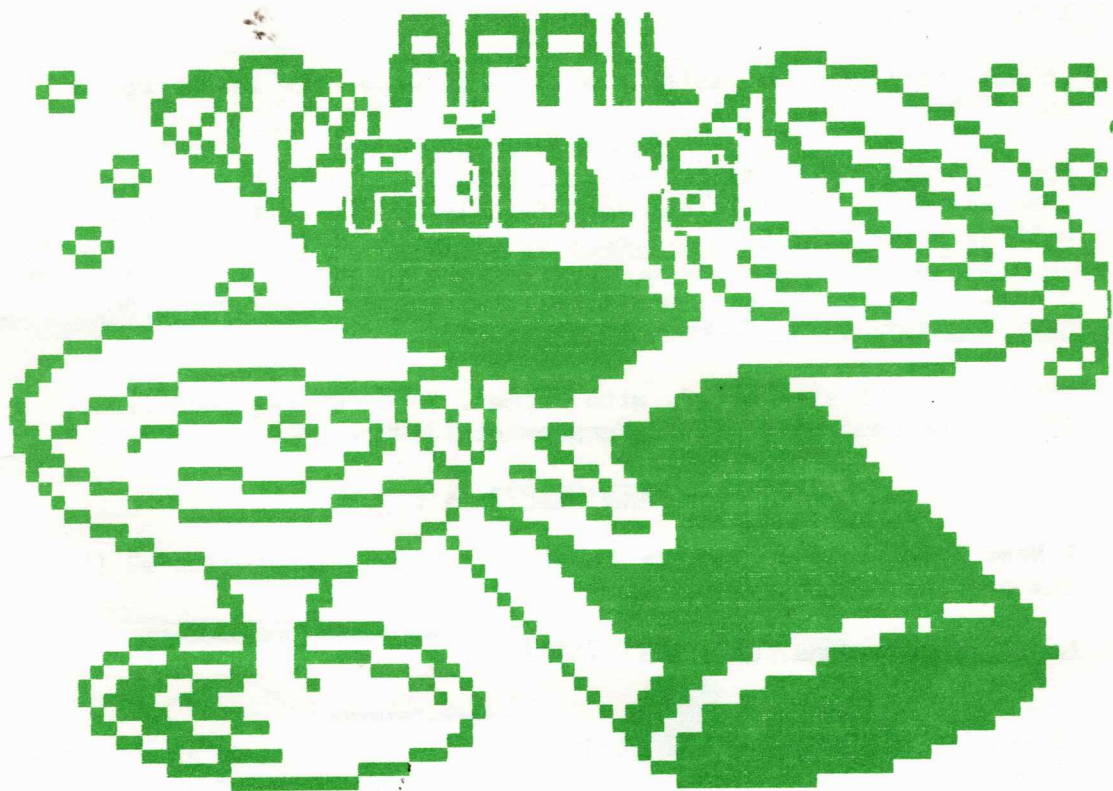

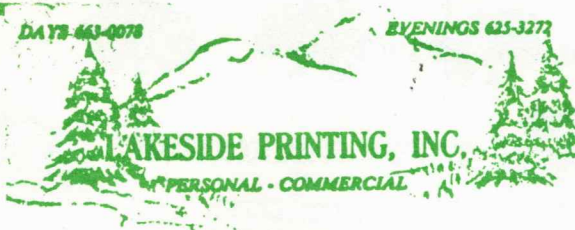
