NEWSWATCH

Tri-County Asphalt Corp., which quarries the scar at the north end of Lake Hopatcong, proposes a 16.5 acre extension of it's 60 acre operation. The Lake Hopatcong Regional Planning Board is objecting to the proposal. The Board is particularly concerned with a one acre retention basin which they say will essentially destroy a tributary into the already shallow, silted and weed-filled Woodport Cove of Lake Hopatcong. Ten years ago the Lk. Hop. Reg. Plan. Board successfully blocked plans by Tri-County to do the same thing. NJDEP public hearings are geing requested by the Board.

Liffy Island acquisition plans, which officials and residents alike believed were ready for completion were abruptly broken-off by the twp. council. Unable to agree on a purchase price the council ordered a stop to negotiating and a return of the Green Acres money to the state. Liffy Island is the large undeveloped island across from the LFYC Clubhouse. The Lake Hopatcong Regional Planning Board is now exploring alternative ways to purchase the 26 acres remaining on Liffy Island and 75 acres along Woodport Bay. Lake Forest residents should make their views about Liffy Island known to the township and other area officials. The fate of Liffy Island will effect the quality of Upper Lake Hopatcong as well as the visual outlook we all enjoy.

The Morris County Park Commission is one giant step closer to it's development plans for the 600 acres of Saffin's Rock Rill Reservation on Weldon Road just this side of Mahlon Dickerson Reservation. A consulting firm hired by the county recommended uses including a fitness course and nature trails, a planetarium, an outreach center of the Morris Museum of Arts and Sciences and an environmental education center. Possible lease tenants for some of the late Richard Saffin's buildings are the Jefferson Twp. Day Care Inc. and the Milton Garden Club's use of the greenhouse for teaching classes and growing plants. Jeff. Twp. has received a copy of the report and will be meeting with the consultant and county officials for discussion of plans.




Dear Neighbors:


