STUFFED FLOUNDER

- 2 tsp. olive oil, divided
- 1/2 Cup chopped scallions
(green onions)
- 1 garlic clove, minced
- 1 cup chopped mushrooms
- 1 tsp. salt, divided
- 1/8 tsp. each pepper and
ground thyme
- 2 Flounder fillets, 6 oz. each
- 1 tsp. each lemon juice and
chopped fresh parsley
- 1/2 tsp. grated lemon peel

In small skillet heat 1 tsp. oil, add scallion and garlic and saute until softened. Add mushrooms, 1/4 tsp. salt, and the pepper and thyme and saute for 5 minutes. Pre-heat oven to 400°F. Sprinkle fillets with lemon juice and remaining 3/4 tsp. salt. Spoon half of mushroom mixture onto center of each fillet and roll to enclose filling, secure each with a toothpick. Transfer rolls seam-side down to shallow 1 quart flameproof casser-

STUFFED MUSHROOMS

- 1 lb. box fresh mushrooms
- 1/2 cup bread crumbs (unseasoned)
- 1 egg
- olive oil
- 2 tablespoons Italian grated cheese
- 2 cloves garlic, finely chopped
- 1 sprig parsley
- salt and pepper

Rinse mushrooms thoroughly, then remove stem from caps. Chop stems into small pieces. In a frying pan, add about 1 or 2 tablespoons olive oil to brown the garlic; saute the mushrooms stems in the oil. When fully cooked, remove from heat and let cool. Add bread crumbs, egg and cheese and season to taste. This should be a moist, sticky mixture. Fill each cap and place in pan with a little olive oil to prevent sticking. Bake for 15 minutes at 425°.

CRABMEAT CASSEROLE

Saute in butter until tender, 1 chopped onion and 1 green pepper (or pimiento).

Add:

- 2 eggs
- 1 can cream of mushroom soup
- 1 can crabmeat
- 1 1/2 cups bread crumbs

Put into greased casserole. Bake at 350° for 30 minutes (in pan of water).


